Are Afghan women's rights – and US support for those rights – backsliding in the struggle to create peace? The health, education, and equality of Afghan women has been critically important to the US. For many Americans, early images of a "liberated" Afghanistan with gleaming new girls' schools was a welcome side effect to the hunt for Osama Bin Laden. But local laws have again become more conservative in Afghanistan. And with talk of reconciliation with the Taliban, some worry that women have become less of a priority to the Obama administration. This month, we ask: do women's rights in Afghanistan still matter?
